NB Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Centre of Excellence

This working group, comprised of Dr. Nicole LeBlanc (inset photo), Maria DesRoches (community coordinator), Annette Cormier (project manager), Mélissa Bonenfant (administrative assistant), Lisa Gay Taylor (community coordinator), Natacha Landry (community coordinator), Cynthia Sewell (Aboriginal Liaison Officer for First Nations), developped a unique frontline health service delivery model (health determinants unique to First Nations).

This model is culturally appropriate, safe, and promotes the well-being of individuals living with FASD, of families and of First Nations communities while respecting their culture and values. The Centre had to decolonize its usual practices by merging Western science with First Nations science. This reflects the reconciliation and peace-restoring process with First Nations. This model also meets the mandate and recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action.

The strength of the "dreamcatcher" model stems from the approval and support of all 15 Aboriginal communities in the province. It is a shared responsibility to help promote interdependence and make sure that clients with fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (3 generations) and their families have a strong and safe base foundation.

The development of this unique model enabled the implementation of a new approach to improve practices not only with Aboriginal communities in New Brunswick, but also with the entire population of New Brunswick.
